

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend marks the beginning of an important chapter in the life and history of our parish with the opening of **St. Joseph's College Seminary**. Bishop Jugis announced the opening of the seminary this past March on the Feast of St. Joseph. While the men will be studying at Belmont Abbey College, they will be housed for the time being in the former Poor Clare Monastery on our campus – which was also named in honor of St. Joseph. The hope is that in the near future land can be secured near Belmont Abbey so that a proper seminary building can be built. Until then, our parish has the honor and privilege of hosting these good young men here at St. Ann's!

St. Joseph's is part of Bishop Jugis' plan to foster vocations in our growing diocese. As our Catholic population continues to increase, we need more men to answer God's call to serve

as priests. As priestly vocations need to be cultivated over a period of time, and because research shows that most priests first consider a calling to a priestly vocation in their teen years, opening a college seminary here in our diocese makes a lot of sense. My personal hope is that by having the seminary here, many of our young men in the parish will be inspired to discern a priestly vocation. Please pray for this!

Of course a project of this magnitude and importance requires a great deal of prayer in order to be successful, and so I am making a plea to all of you to pray earnestly for the success of the seminary. As the seminary is beginning here, I think it our parish's duty and privilege to both pray for the success of the seminary and to provide a warm environment in which these men can grow in virtue and in a priestly identity. From time to time you will see Fr. Kauth, the seminary's rector, as well as the seminarians at parish Masses and events, so please welcome them warmly. But most importantly, pray for them – especially those of you who go to Eucharistic Adoration. Our ancient foe, the devil, often tries to thwart such great undertakings in the Church, but we can help keep him in check with our fervent prayers and sacrifices on behalf of the seminary.

I also ask that you be especially solicitous of Fr. Kauth. While he is very excited about this new undertaking, it's an incredible amount of work for him – work that is both taxing and stressful. He needs your prayers. Moreover, from time to time he will be calling upon our parish to help out with various needs in the seminary, and I trust you will be generous in responding to his requests.

As always, I am grateful for the great generosity of this parish. While I may be biased, I think it would be hard to find a better parish to host the inaugural years of the seminary.



Jubilee Year of Mercy August 7, 2016

Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time
Last Sunday's "Parable of the rich fool"
delivered a compelling reason to do the right
thing--now: "You fool, this night your life will
be demanded of you" (Luke 12:20). Today,
Jesus warns us: "You also must be prepared, for
at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man
will come" (12:40). Though we do not know
when our Master will come, we do know what
our Master expects to find. Jesus expects us to

be vigilant (12:37) and diligent (12:42) in our work for the kingdom, but also filled with reverent mercy toward our fellow servants and ourselves. Hopefully, Jesus' warning not to get drunk and beat each other up (12:45) does not apply to us literally! But what changes do I need to make, right now, so that the many people outside "the Master's house" will want to come inside to experience the healing comfort of Jesus' own mercy in the compassion of Jesus' modern-day disciples?



If your children cry or scream during the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, please be sensitive to those around you by taking your child to one of our cry rooms. The cry rooms are reserved for families with small children. Everyone else is requested to sit in the church.

To those in the Cry Rooms for Mass

Please remember that these rooms are an extension of the church itself. Therefore, please be as reverent as possible during Mass. These rooms exist to help you train your children how to attend Mass properly; thus, they should not be used as play rooms. While everyone who uses the cry rooms expects them to be a bit noisier than the church, disruptive games or toys are better left at home. Moreover, conversations in the cry rooms should be kept to a minimum during Mass. *Thank you for your consideration*.
