Dear Parishioners,

I do hope many of you are praying the **Novena to Our Lady** in preparation for our **parish consecration** on December 8th. In this period of transition for our country, we need the Blessed Virgin Mary to intercede for us more than ever. That's precisely why I wish to consecrate our parish once again to her Immaculate Heart.

As I mentioned last Sunday, we will pray the prayer of consecration after the 7 p.m. Latin Mass on December 8th, the **Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception**. We will then have adoration until midnight to pray for our country and to make reparation for the sins of our nation, especially the sin of abortion. As December

8th is a *holy day of obligation*, please make sure to attend Mass that day. We'll have Masses in English at 7 a.m. and 12:10 p.m., and a Latin Mass at 7 p.m.


This coming week our artist for the new mini-murals will be in town to take precise measurements of the niches and to complete the creative process of designing the details of the murals! Please pray that this process goes smoothly. As I mentioned a few weeks ago, we have the money to begin the first minimural, but we still need to raise another \$75,000 before we can begin the second mini-mural. As you plan your year-end giving, please consider giving to this project!

Lastly, this year for Christmas our parish is getting a very special gift: a small shrine dedicated to the **Infant of Prague**. This past September I had an opportunity to spend a couple of days in Prague en route to an ordination in Rome, and while there I procured a replica of the Infant that we will enshrine in the Narthex. Assuming that the shrine is completed on time, we will bless our new statue at the Midnight Mass of Christmas!

I've had a devotion to the Infant of Prague for a few years now, and I've prayed several novenas to Him for various things in our parish (including the procurement of funds for our apse mural). As the Infant has always been generous in granting my prayer requests for St. Ann's, it seems very appropriate that we should honor Him. If anyone would like to memorialize our new shrine for the Infant of Prague, you may do so for \$10,000. Please contact me directly.
