Dear Parishioners,

As we come to the end of the Easter Season and move into Ordinary Time, we have many beautiful feast days to celebrate. Today in our diocese and in many dioceses throughout our country, we are celebrating our Lord's Ascension into Heaven, although traditionally the Lord's Ascension is celebrated on a Thursday – 40 days after Easter, which we did with the special Latin Mass this past Thursday night. Of course, the Season of Easter will end next Sunday with Pentecost. But after Pentecost we will celebrate Holy Trinity Sunday, followed by Corpus Christi, and then on Friday, 12 June 2015: The Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, followed by the Immaculate Heart of Mary the following day.

As is our custom, we will once again celebrate **40 Hours** this year in anticipation of the Solemnity of Corpus Christi. 40 Hours will begin on Thursday, 04 June 2015, with a Latin Mass at 7 p.m., and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will continue until noon on Saturday, 06 June 2015. I hope many of you will take the opportunity to spend an hour with our Eucharistic Lord to thank Him for His many graces. As always, we will have our annual **Corpus Christi procession** after the 10:30 Mass on Sunday, 07 June 2015. I invite all of our First Communicants this year to come dressed in your First Communion suits and dresses and help lead the procession.

Celebrating Corpus Christi and 40 Hours is an important event for our parish each year, so please consider taking one of the half hour adoration time slots during our 40 Hours Devotion. This 40 Hour period of Adoration is a time for us to render homage and praise to our Lord for the great gift of the Eucharist, and to thank our Lord for His many blessings to us. And there are many graces that are poured out upon all who reverently participate. As we celebrate 40 Hours this year, I ask you especially to pray for more vocations to the priesthood and religious life, especially amongst the young people of our parish.

On another note, I am forming a new ministry at St. Ann's to help maintain our **website**. Currently, we are in the process of overhauling our parish website. As the new website will incorporate many more pictures and videos, I am looking for parishioners who are willing to take pictures and create videos of various parish events with which we can regularly update the website. 


