Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday is the feast day of our patroness, St. Ann. This is a day of grace for our parish, as well as a day for us to offer gratitude to our Lord and His saintly grandmother for all the blessings that have been bestowed upon our parish these past 60 years. As we honor our patroness, I pray that we will always live up to our parish tagline: "The little parish with the big heart." Truly, I hope that charity and unity of faith will always prevail among us.

A couple of weeks ago I mentioned in a homily that occasionally I am made aware of posts on Facebook and other public places on the internet in which some St. Ann's parishioners make rather harsh judgments about others who don't share their views on things such as the wearing of chapel veils to Mass, how best to receive Holy Communion, proper dress for Mass, Catholic schools vs. homeschooling, and the Latin Mass vs. the *Novus Ordo* Mass. I brought this up because I've known of parishioners who've left St. Ann's because they've found some of our other parishioners judgmental and condescending.

Our parish has always been a place of diversity of some sort. While it is perfectly normal for each of us to have our preferences when it comes to how we worship and how we practice our Faith, we must be willing to allow for a certain diversity of practice in others, especially if what they're doing is allowed by the Church or if what they're not doing is not required by the Church. As Catholics we can have legitimate differences of opinion on the wearing of chapel veils, reception of Holy Communion, the best ways to educate our kids, and whether to worship in the ordinary form or extraordinary form of the Mass. Holy Mother Church gives us options on these matters. While we may not like all the options Holy Mother Church gives us, and while some options may be objectively preferable to other options, I do hope we can all be patient and respectful of those who may have different opinions. We are a family, which means we must be willing to put up with one another!

Overall I find our parish to be a very warm and inviting place. I love the fact that so many of you stay after Mass on Sunday to visit with other parishioners in the piazza, and I am constantly edified by your generosity. But let's all be careful about labeling or judging our fellow parishioners. There should never be a "caste system" mentality here in which some people consider themselves better Catholics than others. Instead, let us always strive to "be of one mind, sympathetic, loving toward one another, compassionate, humble" (1 Peter 3:8).



To those in the Cry Rooms for Mass

Please remember that these rooms are an extension of
the church itself. Therefore, please be as reverent as
possible during Mass. These rooms exist to help you
train your children how to attend Mass properly; thus,
they should not be used as play rooms. While
everyone who uses the cry rooms expects them to be a
bit noisier than the church, disruptive games or toys
are better left at home. Moreover, conversations in the
cry rooms should be kept to a minimum during Mass.
