Dear Parishioners,

Last Sunday I spoke in my homily about stewardship, mentioning that it's important for us to be good stewards of not only our time, talent, and treasure, but also of our faith. We are called to good stewards as a means of practicing the virtue of charity and of showing our gratitude to God for all of His blessings to us. Moreover, when we practice stewardship well, i.e., with hearts full of love and with the ultimate intention of glorifying our Lord, our Lord fills us with His grace and mercy, and we gain merit that prepares us for Heaven.

This weekend many of you have been exercising stewardship through your participation with our annual parish Carnival! I'm grateful to all who have acted as volunteers, sponsors, and particularly those who serve on our Carnival Committee under the capable leadership of Chris Brunhuber. I'm also grateful to everyone who simply came and enjoyed the day. As you all know, we rely on the Carnival revenues to help meet our operating budget every year, and simply coming and spending a little money helps a great deal!

In the coming months we will have many opportunities for you to practice stewardship around the parish, and I hope you'll take the time to do so. Next weekend is Respect Life Sunday, and as we always do, we'll have our annual **Life Chain** taking place on the sidewalk along Park Road from 2-3 p.m. Participating in Life Chain is a good way to be a good steward of your faith by publicly witnessing to the inestimable value of human life and to the sadness of the scourge of abortion in our society. Per our usual, we'll have signs available for all who wish to participate.

Another way to be a good steward of your faith in the month of October is by participating in our **First Friday Mass and Holy Hour of Reparation** that will take place on 7 October. As the diocesan priests retreat will be taking place October 3-7 (and there will be no daily Mass), we'll have a special Mass at 6 p.m. on 7 October (Latin), followed by a Holy Hour of Reparation at 7:15 p.m. to make reparation for all the sins against life and human dignity. I hope you can join us for this special evening.

Another way to practice stewardship is by participating in our first *Gaudium Musicae* concert of the season at 5 p.m. on Sunday, 23 October. As always, we're in need of sponsors for the concert, volunteers to help with the reception, and people who simply attend! Tickets are available on our parish website and will be available at the door. Please contact the parish office if you can help with the concert.

Of course there are many other things going on in the parish that are listed in this bulletin. I do hope all of you will look for ways to be more attentive to being good stewards so that we can all grow together in holiness as a parish family.


