Dear Parishioners,

We are just a week away from our **mission trip to India**, and I am very grateful to all of you who have donated so far. Our American dollars go a very long way in India, and so I know that we will be able to accomplish some very good things while we're there with the monies that have been provided so far. If you'd like to donate, you still have this week to do so. You can drop off cash or checks in the office, or you may donate on our online giving page of our website.

I also ask for your prayers for this mission trip, that the team from our parish may travel in safety and good health, and that we may minister well to the people we meet. I especially ask those of you who come to Adoration to remember us there.

We will be flying out next Sunday evening, 12 February 2017, and we will return on Sunday, 26 February 2017.

The holy season of **Lent** will soon be upon us. In fact next Sunday, 12 February 2017, is known as *Septuagesima Sunday* in the ancient calendar of the Church. Septuagesima Sunday marks a 3-week period of prayer and contemplation right before Lent to help us prepare for the fasting and penances to come. This *pre-Lent* is a time for us to fix our minds and hearts more closely upon our Lord's Paschal Mystery, to contemplate His goodness and mercy, and to begin the process of conversion. Ideally, the 3 weeks of Septuagesima should be a time for increased prayer and meditation. You will note that while we will continue wearing green in our Novus Ordo Masses next Sunday, in our Latin Masses we will begin wearing violet in anticipation of Lent.

As we prepare for Lent (Ash Wednesday is 01 March 2017), please bring in your old palms from last year's Palm Sunday. We burn them every year, and then use those ashes for our Ash Wednesday Masses. As you collect your old palms, I encourage you to give some thought to what sins and vices you would like to burn out of your life in Lent. Remember, Lent is not about making sacrifices and fasting simply for the sake of sacrificing and fasting. Our fasting and sacrifices should help us root out sin and become holier people. This can only happen when it is coupled with humble prayer and a love for our Lord.

As we look forward to Lent, be sure to mark your calendars for our annual **Lenten mission**, which will begin the 1st Sunday of Lent (05 March 2017). This year we are privileged to be hosting Fr. Joseph Tuscan, OFM Cap., who will be speaking on the Wounds of Christ. Per our usual schedule, the mission talks will begin at 7 p.m. on Sunday night and continue at the same time every evening until Wednesday, 08 March 2017. Confessions will be available every night of the mission. Please pray for the success of the mission!
