I hope many of you were able to attend the Eucharistic Congress this weekend at the Charlotte Convention Center. It's hard to believe we've been doing this now for 14 years! I am sorry for the inconvenience of not having confessions or Mass last night as usual, but it's for a good cause!

Please remember that this Friday, 14 September 2018, will be a special day of prayer and penance for our parish as we celebrate the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. After the 8:30 a.m. Mass that morning I will expose the relic of the True Cross on the main altar. It will be available all day for veneration. Then at 5 p.m. we will have a Holy Hour of Reparation, followed by a Mass that we will offer in reparation for the sins of the Church.

Please come and pray with us that day. I ask that you pray especially for the healing of all the victims, and that the perpetrators will repent and try to make some amends for their terrible deeds. We should also pray simply for the purification of the Church, and that all of us, clerics and laity alike, will strive for a greater purity and holiness in our daily lives.
