Dear Parishioners,

Today we are having a very special event after the 12:30 Mass: a **Eucharistic Procession** in honor of Christ the King. While the Feast of Christ the King is celebrated as the Last Sunday in Ordinary Time in the new calendar of the Church, in the Latin Mass calendar it is celebrated on the last Sunday in October. Immediately after the 12:30 Mass, we will have a Eucharistic Procession around our property, and down Hillside Avenue and Willow Oak Road. Please join us as we pray for our nation and give glory and honor to Christ our King!

Do not forget that Thursday, 01 November 2018, is **All Saints Day** (a *holy day of obligation*). Masses are at 7 a.m., 12:10 p.m., and 7 p.m. (Latin). As I mentioned in last Sunday's bulletin, we will be exposing all of the saints relics we have here in the parish on the main altar from after the 7 a.m. until the close of confessions at 6:30 p.m. On Friday, 02 November 2018, we will celebrate **All Souls Day** with Masses at 7 a.m. (Latin), 8:30 a.m., and 7 p.m.

Please keep in mind that an **indulgence** is granted to the faithful who devoutly visit a cemetery and pray for the dead (even if the prayer is only mental) during the first 8 days of November. A plenary indulgence, applicable only to the souls in Purgatory, is also granted to the faithful, who piously visit a church or a public oratory on All Souls Day. In visiting the church or oratory, it is required that one Our Father and the Creed be recited. Both of these indulgences are granted under the normal conditions, i.e., one must be baptized and in the state of grace, be free from an attachment to sin, go to confession within 20 days, receive Holy Communion on the day you visit the cemetery or church, and offer prayers for the intentions of the Holy Father (a *Creed* and an *Our Father* will suffice). For those of you who are interested, I'll be leading a group of parishioners in prayer at Belmont Abbey Cemetery on Sunday, 04 November 2018, at 3 p.m.

If you would like to have Mass offered for your deceased loved ones, please use the **All Souls envelopes** and write the names of your loved ones on the envelope. We will be celebrating a novena of Masses during November for all of those souls whose names are on the envelopes. You may turn in your envelopes at any time during the month of November. The Book of the Dead is also available in the narthex for you to list the names of your beloved deceased for whom you desire prayers.

Lastly, during this month of October, which is dedicated to the Holy Rosary, I've encouraged all of you to pray the Rosary daily. While October is coming to an end, I still want to encourage you to make the Rosary a part of your daily prayers. Many graces are given to those who pray the Rosary daily, especially when a family prays it together.




