Dear Parishioners,

Happy St. Patrick's Day and 2nd Sunday of Lent! I pray that your Lenten disciplines of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are bearing fruit in your souls. Just remember that what matters most is not so much the rigor with which we undertake these important disciplines, but the love with which we do them! Without true charity in our hearts, these disciplines are voided of their meaning and efficacy.

To aid you in your Lenten disciplines, we are continuing to have a **Holy Hour of Reparation** at 6 p.m. and **Stations of the Cross** at 7 p.m. on Fridays during Lent. The Holy Hour of Reparation is a good opportunity for us to make reparation for our own sins as well as those of the whole world, while the Stations of the Cross help us to meditate more deeply on our Lord's passion. Both help us to grow in our love for God and neighbor. As I mentioned last Sunday, we can receive a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions by attending the full Holy Hour, provided that we are free from any attachment to sin.

Also, please keep in mind that any monies put into the poor boxes in the narthex of the church during Lent will go toward the building of a much-needed chapel for the Missionaries of the Poor in India. The chapels the MOP brothers currently use are very ill-suited to their needs, and it's my hope that we can raise a significant amount of money to help them with this project. Moreover, this is a means for our entire parish to engage in **almsgiving**, which can also help us make reparation for sins.

Lastly, please remember that this Tuesday, 19 March 2019, is the Solemnity of St. Joseph. Because this day is a solemnity, the Church dispenses us from our Lenten fasting. The same is true for the Solemnity of the Annunciation, which will be on Monday, 25 March 2019. So feel free to ease your Lenten fasting on those days in celebration of St. Joseph, the patron of the Universal Church, and the ineffable mystery of the Incarnation.


In the area of time and talent, many individuals commit a certain number of hours each week to prayer and charitable activities.
