

Dear Parishioners,


I've been reflecting upon our experiences as a parish throughout the course of the pandemic, and it has engendered within me a great deal of gratitude. More than anything, I've been edified by the reverence and devotion you've shown toward the Sacraments, most especially during our Sunday Communion services. But there has been, as well, a certain quality to the confessions I've heard in the past two months – perhaps a deeper and more thorough examination of conscience, coupled with a deeper desire for God's mercy.

While I miss terribly the ability to offer Mass publicly and without restrictions on attendance, the limited interactions that I've had with you in the last two months has greatly encouraged me. Thank you for loving God, His Church, and our beautiful Catholic Faith. As we've become accustomed to hearing bad news about the Church (especially as the sins of so many of Her leaders have been made public) seeing your faith, hope, and charity has been a shot in the arm. It's also been so inspiring to learn that people from several other states have traveled to St. Ann's in recent weeks just to receive Holy Communion. As painful and inconvenient as the societal lockdown has been, it has shown me that the Catholic Faith is still alive and well within the hearts and souls of many believers.

Living as we are in a rapidly changing environment, it's been difficult to make definitive plans for parish celebrations like First Holy Communion and the baptism, confirmation, and reception into the Church of those who've gone through RCIA in the past year. Bear with us as we do our best to plan according to the guidance given to us by the Diocese. I'm sorry things of such importance have been put on hold, but I trust you all understand. As our state continues reopening and lifting restrictions, and as further guidelines are given to us by the governor, we will do our best to schedule these celebrations in a way that enables some loved ones to attend along with those who are receiving Sacraments.

As we prepare to move into Phase 2 of the state's reopening process, keep an eye on the website and the Friday 5 emails for details on how we will offer Mass. If you do not yet receive the Friday 5 emails, please call the office to sign up for them.

With hope that we will begin to worship together again very soon,



Latin Mass Q&A: What do the Classes in the above calendar mean? The Class is the level of importance or solemnity (1st-4th) associated with that day's Saint or commemoration. A 1st Class Feast Day are many Sundays and major solemnities like Christmas. Feria is a non-feast day and readings typically revert to the prior Sunday readings.

St. Paschal Baylon:

Franciscan lay brother and mystic. Born to a peasant family at Torre Hermosa, in Aragon, on Whitsunday, he was christened Pascua in honor of the feast.



According to accounts of his early life, Paschal labored as a shepherd for his father, performed miracles, and was distinguished for his austerity. He also taught himself to read. Receiving a vision which told him to enter a nearby Franciscan community, he became a Franciscan lay brother of the Alcantrine reform in 1564, and spent most of his life as a humble doorkeeper. He practiced rigorous asceticism and displayed a deep love for the Blessed Sacrament, so much so that while on a mission to France, he defended the doctrine of the Real Presence against a Calvinist preacher and in the face of threats from other irate Calvinists. Paschal died at a friary in Villareal, and was canonized in 1690. In 1897 Pope Leo XIII declared him patron of all eucharistic confraternities and congresses. To All Parents with Infants and Small Children
One of the most beautiful blessings of our Parish is that we have so many babies and small kids! While all children are most welcome in the church, please keep in mind that the acoustics in our church are excellent, which means that their voices carry. If your children cry or scream during the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, please be sensitive to those around you by taking your child to one of our cry rooms. *The cry rooms are reserved for families with small children. Everyone else is requested to sit in the church.*

To those in the Cry Rooms for Mass
Please remember that these rooms are an extension of the church itself. Therefore, please be as reverent as possible during Mass. These rooms exist to help you train your children how to attend Mass properly; thus, they should not be used as play rooms. While everyone who uses the cry rooms expects them to be a bit noisier than the church, disruptive games or toys are better left at home. Moreover, conversations in the cry rooms should be kept to a minimum during Mass. *Thank you for your consideration.*

Outdoor Speakers

We have outdoor speakers for those whose small children are too loud for the cry rooms or narthex. Please be considerate of your fellow parishioners if your children are making a lot of noise.
