If you have a health concern of any sort, or if your health has been compromised in any way, please stay at home.



Dear Parishioners,

What a joy it was to have Mass in church with you again last Sunday after 9 long weeks! I'm sorry we didn't have more time to prepare, but I didn't know about the restrictions on public worship being lifted until after 6pm on Saturday evening! Quite fittingly, the Introit for Mass last Sunday (in both the Novus Ordo and Latin Mass) came from Isaiah 48:20: "Proclaim a joyful sound and let it be heard; proclaim to the ends of the earth: The Lord has freed His people, alleluia." Indeed, after 9 weeks of restrictions, the Lord has freed us to worship Him publicly once more! Let's rejoice in that.

Of course, how we will proceed from here on out isn't completely clear yet. The restraining order against the restrictions on public indoor worship is temporary, so things could change again. As always, please keep an eye on the website and the Friday 5 emails for the most up to date information on our liturgies and parish activities and events.

Many thanks, as well, for your cooperation with trying to keep our campus as safe as possible. Several of you were so gracious to help cleaning the church between Masses last Sunday, and we'll need to continue doing so for weeks to come. I'm also grateful for your attention to social distancing protocols and CDC guidelines.

Some of you have asked if all the measures we're putting into place are absolutely necessary, especially wearing face masks. In this regard I have two goals: 1) to make our parish as safe as possible, and 2) to be obedient to our bishop. While I know that there's a wide variety of opinions on face masks, the diocese has asked us to encourage folks to follow the CDC guidelines for preventing the spread of COVID-19, which includes wearing face masks. Thus, out of obedience, I am encouraging you to doing so while inside the church. But those who choose not to wear a mask will not be barred from coming to Mass.

In the meantime, let's continue praying for all those being adversely affected by COVID-19, especially our own parishioners. This deadly virus has taken a toll on all of us in a variety of ways. So let's be patient, gentle, humble, and ever charitable with one another.

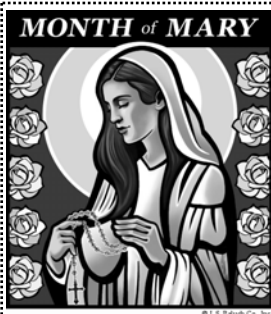

The Latin Mass has a different liturgical calendar and readings than the Novus Ordo (English) Mass. Any Mass schedule changes will be listed on Page 2 of the bulletin.

**Latin Mass Q&A:** What do the Classes in the above calendar mean? The Class is the level of importance or solemnity (1st-4th) associated with that day's Saint or commemoration. A 1st Class Feast Day are many Sundays and major solemnities like Christmas. Feria is a non-feast day and readings typically revert to the prior Sunday readings.

### David I of Scotland:

David, the youngest son of Scotland's virtuous queen, (Saint) Margaret, succeeded his brother to the Scottish throne in 1124. David's friend, (Saint) Aelred, abbot of the English monastery of Rievaulx, was later to recount David's religious devotion and his generosity to the poor.

From his riches he also endowed the founding of several dioceses and many monasteries. David was to express profound remorse for an ill-conceived and ill-fated invasion of England he had ordered on behalf of his niece. He also suffered the sorrow of the premature death of his only son. On Friday, May 22, 1153, as David was nearing death, he received the anointing of the sick and Viaticum, after which he devoted himself to reciting the Psalms with those at his bedside. The next day, the king told those urging him to take a rest from his devotions, "Let me rather think about the things of God, so that my spirit may set out strengthened on its journey from exile to home. When I stand before God's tremendous judgment seat, you will not be able to answer for me or defend me." He thus continued with his prayers. David died at dawn on Sunday, May 24.
