Dear Parishioners,

As you all know by now, Governor Cooper has now extended Phase 2 of the state's reopening plan to at least 11 September 2020. This means that, for the time being, we are still limited to 140 people in church at our Masses. I am hopeful, though, that we will move into Phase 3 sometime in the next month or so, and that doing so will allow us to have more people in the church. We've not been given any guidance yet on what Phase 3 regulations will look like, so it's impossible to determine at this point what will be allowable.

As we move into Phase 3 and are given the protocols that we're expected to follow, we will make some determinations on how long we will continue offering Communion Services and live-streaming of our Masses as we cannot continue offering these services indefinitely. Our live-streaming is being provided by Tan Books staff, and we are blessed to enjoy their generosity in this regard, so be sure to patronize them! Moreover, once we have the Phase 3 protocols, we will also make decisions on how and when we can restart our various parish activities and ministries.

I'm so grateful to all of you who have returned to Sunday Mass. It seems that each Sunday we have a few more families attending, and it's great to reconnect with all of you! Be assured that we are taking appropriate steps to ensure that our building is sanitized and to minimize the risk of spreading COVID-19. All the same, let's keep praying for an end to this pandemic.

Please note that we have already decided to postpone the Carnival. Instead of 03 October 2020, the Carnival is now scheduled for 07 November 2020. Please mark your calendars. While perhaps worldly wisdom would encourage us to cancel it outright, this is such a fun and important event for our parish each year that I will only cancel it if I feel we absolutely have to.

Lastly, don't forget that we are planning to begin RCIA on our normal timetable this year. I encourage any of you who have friends or loved ones who are interested in learning more about Catholicism to join our RCIA class. RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults) is the preparatory process for anyone who wishes to become a Catholic. Our RCIA classes begin on Monday, 14 September 2020, and will continue through April 2021. Our classes will meet on Mondays from 7 p.m. – 8:30 p.m. If you or someone you know wishes to enroll, please call Marcy Rothe at 704-523-4641, ext. 221.

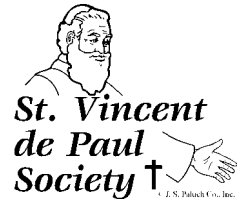
