Dear Parishioners,

“Rejoice in the Lord always! Again I say, rejoice! Indeed, the Lord is near.” These are the words of the entrance antiphon for today’s Mass on this Third Sunday of Advent (also known as *Gaudete Sunday*), and they signal for us the tone of today’s liturgy. While the violet we wear on most days of Advent indicate that there’s penitential nature to this season, now that we are roughly halfway through Advent, we take a break from our penance and rejoice in joyful anticipation of our Lord’s coming, much like *Laetare Sunday* in Lent. The liturgy today reminds us that soon the great feast of Christmas will be upon us, and this is cause for rejoicing indeed. Symbolizing a lightening of our penance and our joyful anticipation for Christ’s coming, our liturgical color switches from violet to rose today.

Thursday, 17 December, our liturgies will begin to take on an even more eager and anticipatory nature as we move into a period of special preparation during Advent known as the Octave before Christmas. During this time special antiphons (known as the “O” antiphons) are used at vespers and for the *Alleluia* verse before the Gospel at Mass. These antiphons have been around since at least the 8th century, and each antiphon recalls a particular scriptural title of Jesus, announcing his imminent arrival and recalling the Old Testament prophecies of Isaiah. Moreover, they tell us something about the person of Christ and about salvation history. The famous Advent song *O Come, O Come, Emmanuel* that is often used this time of year is based upon these antiphons.

In response to Gov. Cooper's executive order mandating a greater use of face coverings, our diocesan Chancery recently issued new regulations about wearing face coverings at diocesan and parish properties. Although religious services are constitutionally protected and exempt from the order, our offices and activity centers are not exempt. Therefore, everyone over the age 5 is now required to use a face covering at all times when sharing a space inside the Allen Center with others who are outside of one's household, even while maintaining 6-ft distancing. I also ask that everyone using the Allen Center for any **group activity** have his/her temperature taken upon arrival, complete a health screening form to certify that they have not exhibited any symptoms of COVID, and use hand sanitizer upon entering and exiting the building. I know these protocols are inconvenient, and I truly appreciate your willingness to cooperate with them so that we can best ensure our ability to continue operating our normal parish activities.

As I mentioned in Mass last Sunday, please remember that you **must** sign-up to attend one of Christmas Masses on our website. No one will be permitted in the church at our Christmas Masses without a reservation. I hate to take these types of measures, but it’s the only way we can ensure that we adhere to our current safety protocols. Fortunately, Bishop Jugis has given us permission this year to start Christmas Eve Masses earlier than normal, and we have added two Masses to make sure we have plenty of capacity for all who wish to attend Christmas Mass. Our Masses will be at 2:30, 4:30, and 6:30pm on Christmas Eve (all in English). We will also have Midnight Mass (Latin high Mass), 9am (English), and 11 (Latin low Mass) on Christmas Day.

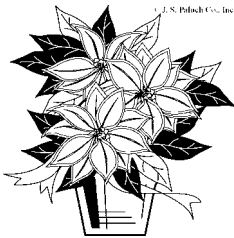
