Dear Parishioners,

I'm seeing a lot of sadness in our world – more than the usual amount. Of course, being privy to the sufferings of so many is an occupational hazard of being a priest and pastor. We priests labor amidst the sins and sufferings of our people, hoping to provide direction and encouragement, relief and redemption.

In my work as a priest, I've learned that suffering is exhausting, and that when one's sufferings are great, it's easy to despair. In those moments when our sufferings seem unbearable, we need to remind ourselves that giving up and despairing are not the

answers. In truth, despair should be completely foreign to the heart of a Christian, for in Christ our Savior we can see how the worst sufferings can be transformed into the greatest good. That's really the message of the Cross. Suffering, when borne with faith, hope, and charity, leads to redemption.

I know that so many of you are suffering in various ways right now. Some of you have tremendous pressures weighing upon you, leading you to fear and anxiety. But remember that if God is allowing you to suffer, He intends to bring a greater good out of it. And if you bear your sufferings with faith, hope, and charity – uniting them to our Lord's suffering on the cross – your suffering will make you holy.

Many Catholics are familiar with the phrase: "offer it up." We say this in difficult moments as a reminder to offer our sufferings to God, because a suffering offered to Him is a potent spiritual force. When we offer our sufferings to God in union with Christ's suffering on the Cross, we make a prayer out of our suffering, we participate in the great work of man's redemption, we make reparation for sin, and procure graces for those for whom we offer our sufferings. Our offering opens up the storehouse of God's graces for those graces to flow back into this world, helping us to grow in sanctity.

One great prayer to memorize that helps us offer our sufferings to God as a prayer comes from Our Lady's apparitions in Fatima. This prayer that was taught to the 3 child seers is called the **Sacrifice Prayer**.

O Jesus, it is for the love of Thee, in reparation for the offenses committed against the Immaculate Heart of Mary, and for the conversion of poor sinners. Amen.

Perhaps we can all memorize this prayer and pray it when suffering and anxiety befall us, trusting that God will put our sufferings to good use.
