Dear Parishioners,

With today's liturgy we enter into that most important week of the year for us Catholics, that week which we call *holy*. And we call this week *holy* because God, in His infinite goodness, takes what should be considered the most horrific and unjust of crimes, the wrongful indictment and execution of His own Son, and makes of it the means for our salvation. In our liturgies of this week we see the conspiracy that brought about Jesus' wrongful arrest. We sit with Christ at the Last Supper as He gives us the inseparable gifts of the priesthood and the Eucharist, and we follow Him into the Garden of Gethsemane to watch with Him. We witness all that He suffers for us, and we stand at the foot of the cross with His Mother as Jesus dies for our sins. And finally, we peer into the empty tomb on the third day and experience anew the glory of His resurrection. What a holy week indeed!

It's a great feeling to be offering the Triduum publicly again this year, as you'll remember that last year we weren't allowed to have parishioners present. Just one last reminder that this year we are beginning to rotate between the English Novus Ordo and Latin Mass Triduum, and this year's Triduum will be a Latin Mass Triduum (and next year we will have an English Novus Ordo Triduum). Because the Triduum is Latin this year, please know that the liturgies will be longer than usual. You can expect the Mass on Holy Thursday to be 2 hours, the Good Friday liturgy to be 2 ½ hours, and the Easter Vigil to be at least 3 ½ hours long.

To make our Holy Week and Easter liturgies as accessible to as many people as possible, we will have the Triduum and Easter liturgies livestreamed into the gym. Moreover, we are requiring a reservation for church seating for the Easter Sunday Masses (but not the Triduum), just as we did for Christmas. I apologize if you and your family are not able to be in the Church, but please know that we are doing the best that we can. Details for signing up are on our website.

Lastly, make this week holy for yourselves by entering more deeply into prayer with our crucified Lord and His Mother. While you may not be able to participate in the liturgies in the same way as in years past, it's still important to meditate this week on all the great mysteries of our salvation. I especially encourage you to meditate upon the Gospel stories of Jesus' suffering, death, and resurrection. And through your prayerful reading and prayer, enter into the mysteries of our Faith, for this week is different than any other week of the year. And be sure to pray for our fellow parishioners who are entering into full communion with the Church through the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil.



This year, instead of offering both an English Novus Ordo and a Latin Mass Triduum in separate venues, we are going to begin offering only one Triduum, rotating each year between the two forms.

St. Thomas Aquinas, the other parish in Charlotte that offers a Sunday Latin Mass, is going to begin doing the same. On the years that we offer the Novus Ordo Triduum, St. Thomas will offer the Latin Mass Triduum, and on the years that they offer the Novus Ordo Triduum, we will offer the Latin Mass Triduum so that we can ensure there is always a Latin Mass Triduum somewhere in Charlotte.

As our parish is better equipped and ready for the Latin Mass Triduum, this year's Triduum will be a Latin Mass Triduum. *Thank you for your understanding.*

A 1st Class Feast Day are many Sundays and major solemnities like Christmas. Feria is a non-feast day and readings typically revert to the prior Sunday readings.
